
The FR, CFR, and LSA are published by Office of the Federal Register (OFR), **National Archives and Records Administration** (NARA).



FINAL RULES ARE CODIFIED (COLLECTED AND PUBLISHED) INTO

THE CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS (CFR)

The CFR is updated once a year based on a quarterly schedule by title.

THE AGENCY ISSUES A FINAL RULE

Includes the full text of the rule and a statement describing the rule's authority and purpose



Provides responses to the comments it received.

THE PUBLIC IS GIVEN TIME TO COMMENT ON THE PROPOSED RULE

The public has a certain period of time to comment. A typical comment period is 60 days, but it could be shorter or much longer.

THE AGENCY ISSUES A PROPOSED RULE



States how the agency is going to enforce the law and/or what a citizen needs to do in order to comply with the law





Proposed rules can create new regulations or amend existing regulations.

FR is published Monday through

Friday, except

Federal holidays.

AN AGENCY MAY INFORM THE PUBLIC OF ITS INTENT TO CREATE A PROPOSED RULE



This is called Advance **Notice of Proposed** Rulemaking (ANPR).



ANPR is not required.

Contains general information about the agency's proposal but not the specific language.
